Statistical unit - Description The legal units are: - legal entities whose existence is recognized by law, irrespective of the persons or institutions that own or are members of them; - natural persons who exercise an economic activity as a self-employed person. The legal unit is always, alone or sometimes with other legal units, the legal support of the statistical unit 'enterprise'. The enterprise consists of the smallest combination of legal units (or their equivalent). It is an organizational unit that produces goods and services and has a certain autonomy of decision-making.
