<i>Statistical unit - Description</i>	The enterprise is the smallest combination of legal units that is an organizational unit producing goods or services, which benefits from a certain degree of autonomy in decision-making, especially for the allocation of its current resources. An enterprise carries out one or more activities at one or more locations. An enterprise may be a sole legal unit.
<i>Statistical population - Title</i>	Employers NSSO exercising their economic activity in sections NACE Rev 2 C to M (Industry, retail trade and services)
<i>Statistical population - Description</i>	An employer is a natural person or legal establishment that employs staff (waged workers). It is incumbent on the employer to declare all their waged staff to the National Social Security Office (ONSS). An exemption is made in the case of Local and Provincial Administrations affiliated to the ONSSAPL, also for Merchant Navy volunteers affiliated to the Emergencies and Contingencies Fund for Seamen (CSPM).
